I was in a car crash a few years ago, which left a scar above my eye. Trilogy's Rosehip Oil Antioxidant + (£16.50, trilogyproducts. com) reduced the scar to almost nothing. It works on stretch marks, too.

I love a good scent.

Neal's Yard Remedies' Wild Rose Beauty Balm (£37, nealsyardremedies.com) not only smells divine, but is a true multitasker. Use with a warm muslin cloth as an exfoliating treatment, leave on overnight as a nourishing mask, or apply a little to cuticles.

I set aside one night a

month for pampering. I'll run a bath and apply Éminence Organic Skin Care's Eight Greens Phyto Masque (£37, theskinsmith. co.uk) letting the steam from the bath open my

You can exfoliate every day, something I learned after using Pai's Organic Kukui & Jojoba Bead Skin Brightening Exfoliator (£20, paiskincare.com). The tiny beads are completely spherical, so they roll over skin rather than jarring it.

Gadgets are my thing.

I can't get enough of Foreo's Luna Mini skin brush (£99, selfridges. com), which is the ultimate power-cleaning tool. It gives me that super clean feeling without irritating my sensitive skin.

I'm too lazy to use a make-up remover *and* a cleanser, so Nude's



Perfect Cleansing Oil (£28, spacenk.com) ticks off two steps in one.

My dehydrated skin

can't cope without Sisley's Hydra-Global (£145, sisley-paris.co.uk). Hove the gel-cream texture of this plumping classic.

I detox my skin once a week using Ren's Glycolactic Radiance Renewal Mask (£30, renskincare.com). I'll leave it on for ten minutes before removing with a warm muslin cloth.

I hate foundation, but Hove a CC cream. Origins' Smarty Plants CC (£29, origins.co.uk) is the last
